

Some 300 students take part in the CSCNO floor hockey tournament

On January 21 and 22, more than 300 grade 3 and 4 students from a dozen Conseil scolaire catholique du Nouvel-Ontario (CSCNO) schools had the opportunity to compete in the boys and girls floor hockey tournament. This friendly competition, which took place at École secondaire catholique Champlain (Chelmsford), attracted more than 1,100 spectators over the two days.

On Saturday, January 21, 14 teams representing 13 CSCNO schools took part in the girls' grade 3-4 tournament. École Félix-Ricard Jaguars "A" edged École St-Pierre in the championship game and finished the tournament with a perfect record of five victories. The following day, 13 teams from 12 schools competed in the boys' grade 3-4 tournament. No less than 164 girls and 152 boys tested their hockey skills during this tournament that promoted friendly competition, fair play and francophone camaraderie. École Alliance St-Joseph Lynx were declared the overall champions of the tournament after edging École Ste-Marie Lions by a score of 4 to 3.
